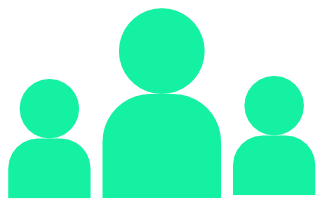

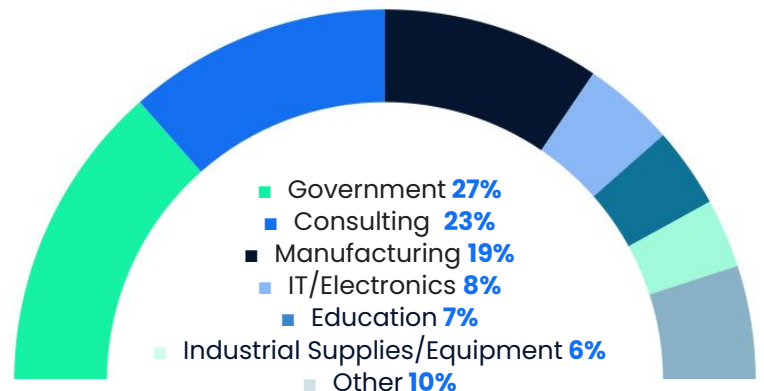

US launches air, naval strikes on Houthi targets in Yemen

The US military conducted strikes on over a dozen Houthi targets in Yemen using aircraft and warships, aiming to protect navigation and enhance security in international waters. Navy destroyers at sea as Hurricane Milton reaches Fla.

Three destroyers – USS Donald Cook, USS Thomas Hudner, and USS Lassen – departed Naval Station Mayport as a precautionary measure ahead of Hurricane Milton, which made landfall near Tampa, Fla. The Navy Region Southeast announced that other ships would secure heavy weather moorings and aircraft will either remain in hangars or relocate. Rear Adm.
